

# Course Description

## Multiple Team Project Management AMS130

### Overview

The customer-facing organizational structure of IT has a number of distinct advantages, but with those advantages come some unique challenges. The incidence of projects involving two or more teams is increasing, and creating a number of scheduling problems for the individual teams. Cross-team dependencies are the biggest challenge.

In this course we will examine three approaches to managing projects that involve two or more teams whose work is dependent upon one another.

### Learning Objectives

- Define multiple team projects
- Understand the unique challenges of leading multiple team projects
- Know the leadership challenges presented by cross-project dependencies
- Identify processes unique to multiple team projects
- Establish and lead a Program Office
- Integrate co-project leads for customer benefit
- Form a super team to plan and lead multiple team projects
- Plan a multiple team project
- Manage the communications plan for a multiple team project

### Format

The format of this course is highly interactive and adaptive to participant's interests and needs. A lecture mixed with discussion approach is used and is accompanied by individual, class and team exercises with team reports.
