

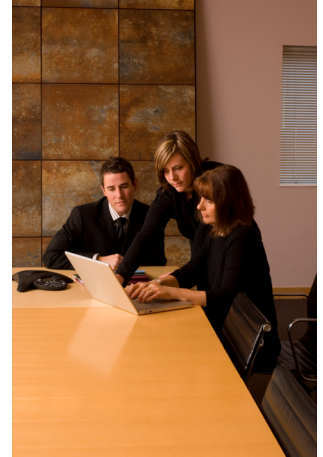
Course Description

Success Strategies for Female Project Managers AMS146

Overview

This course addresses the unique issues facing women project managers. Project management is a field that has traditionally been dominated by men. There is agreement among researchers that there are differences in the ways in which women and men manage. Given the pressure to meet time demands, maintain cost controls, and effectively translate specifications, female project managers must be able to capitalize on those differences to maximize productivity, while gaining the respect and support of the project team, stakeholders, and customers.
