Overview:

Use cases have become the de facto standard for capturing and communicating detailed, functional requirements from the business community to the information technology group. What should be in a use case, however, is not necessarily clearly defined. This 2-day course presents techniques for discovering and communicating business, solution, system, and detail-level use cases. It is designed around effective exercises that allow the participants to apply the concepts in a realistic setting.

The content focuses on helping real people in the real world find and document use cases at varying, audience-focused levels of detail. From the high level perspective of the business use case to the nitty-gritty details of a detailed use case, the transformation of the use case will be made clear.
